



PROGRAM GUIDELINES

All proposed rebates must be pre-approved by Silicon Valley Power (SVP) prior to purchase and installation of the equipment. SVP will have the right to inspect the facility before and after the equipment is installed. The rebate offer expires 6 months after pre-approval or when budgeted funds are depleted, whichever comes first.

Equipment must be purchased and installed within 6 months of pre-approval and a determination will be made at pre-approval regarding the necessity of a pre-inspection.

Applications must be submitted, signed and dated, prior to the scheduling of a post-inspection. A post-inspection must occur within 1 month of the installation date.

Detailed, dated copies of all invoice(s) must be submitted along with pertinent equipment data/cut sheets within 2 months of installation. The invoice must be marked "Paid". Refer to the "Sample Invoice" page for requirement details.

Rebates are offered to replace existing equipment with qualifying efficient electrical equipment or for installing qualifying efficient electrical equipment in new or renovated buildings. Additional requirements may apply to specific types of equipment. Read the information on the specific programs for the equipment in which you are interested.

Qualified efficient electrical equipment installed in facilities served by the City of Santa Clara's Silicon Valley Power is eligible for a rebate. However, equipment purchased for inventory or resale does not qualify.

NEW CONSTRUCTION MUST EXCEED TITLE 24 BY 10%. Silicon Valley Power does not perform Title 24 compliance calculations; you must present the Title 24 documents at the time of application.

The rebate may not be deducted from any electric bill.

The rebate recipient will be responsible for any tax liability resulting from the rebate payment.

SVP will not pay more than the amount stated in the specific program for installation of efficient equipment. Energy efficiency levels must exceed city code or development requirements.

Each customer is limited to receiving a maximum of \$750,000 of Public Benefit funds on an annual basis. This includes all incentives received through the CDR program as well as any other rebates received through other SVP programs. *The Energy Innovation Program grant is excluded from this limit.*
